You must pass this test with a score of 75% . If you fail to pass the test you will be required to attend a Major Unusual Incident training session.

1. (T) (F) The single most important thing for staff to do when an MUI occurs is to take any necessary action to be sure that the consumer is safe.
2. (T) (F) You have 24 hours to call the MUI Hotline after becoming aware of an allegation of physical abuse.
3. (T) (F) When you are reporting an MUI you must both call the Hotline and send an Unusual Incident report form on the incident.
4. (T) (F) A consumer who lives at home with her parents was taken to the hospital by her father and admitted over the weekend. This must be reported as an MUI.
5. (T) (F) When a consumer tells you that another consumer punched her in the eye and threw a full can of pop at her head you must report this incident even though there were no witnesses.
6. (T) (F) A rights code violation is an MUI only if there is an impact on the consumer's health and safety.
7. (T) (F) It would be considered abuse if group home staff called a consumer an insulting name, cursed at him, and threatened to hit him but did not actually do so.
