



## Why a Consistent Ethic of Life?

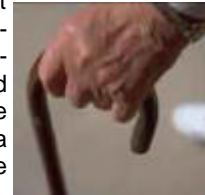
*Excerpt from Joseph Cardinal Bernardin's Address on June 7, 1984 at the Right to Life Convention in Kansas City, Missouri*



It is precisely because I am convinced that demonstrating the linkage between abortion and other issues is both morally correct and tactically necessary for the pro-life position that I have been addressing the theme of a consistent ethic of life for Church and society. The convergence of themes concerning civil rights, human rights and family life with the abortion issue is simply an indication of deeper bonds which exist along the full range of pro-life issues.

The proposals I have made on the linkage of issues are, I submit, a systematic attempt to state the vision which has always been implicit in a Catholic conception of "pro-life." A Catholic view of the meaning of pro-life stresses the interdependence of life in a social setting, the way in which each of us relies upon the premise that others respect my life, and that society exists to guarantee that respect for each person. The interdependence of human life points towards the interrelationship of pro-life issues.

This interrelationship can be illustrated in precise, detailed moral arguments, but that is not my purpose in this address. I would simply appeal to a principle which I suspect is also an element of your own experience. It is the need to cultivate within society an attitude of respect for life on a series of issues, if the actions of individuals or groups are to reflect respect for life in specific choices. The linkage theme of a consistent ethic of life is designed to highlight the common interest and reciprocal need which exist among groups interested in specific issues—peace, abortion, civil rights, justice for the dispossessed or disabled—each of which depends upon a basic attitude of respect for life. The linkage theme provides us with an opportunity to win "friends" for the life issues. Just as we insist on the principle of the right to life, so too we must recognize the responsibility that our commitment places on us. Building bridges to people working on specific life issues demands respect and kindness toward these potential allies. An atmosphere of trust and understanding can do a great deal to promote the goals of the pro-life movement.

## What are the U.S. Bishops Doing for Sudan?

*Excerpt from Catholic Trends, August 28, 2004, Vol. 35, No. 3*

A visit to Sudan and to that nation's Darfur region in early August persuaded him "that the Sudanese government only responds to strong and continuing pressure. They make promises, but I saw few results on the ground," Bishop John Ricard of Pensacola-Tallahassee, Fla., chairman of the U.S. Catholic bishops' Committee on International Policy, said in an Aug. 19 letter to U.S. Secretary of State Colin Powell. Ricard thanked Powell for actions already taken to address the humanitarian crisis in Darfur, but said, "I believe that the United States must exercise even more leadership to prevent a worsening of the crisis."...

...Ricard told Catholic News Service Aug. 16 that there was "no question" that the killings in Darfur represent ethnic

cleansing. He said Sudan's government is engaged in a policy to Arabize and Islamize the population. Rebel groups in Darfur rose up against Sudan's government last year, accusing it of oppressing black Africans in favor of Arabs. While both groups are Muslim, black Africans are primarily farmers, while the Arabs are nomadic herdsman, bringing the two groups into conflict over access to land and water. Ricard said Sudanese officials told him the violence was caused by rebel groups fighting the Khartoum government over Darfur's oil reserves. "Even if this was true, the government's response was way out of proportion—targeting civilians and removing people from their villages," Ricard said. He called this "another way of eliminating people through displacement."...

You will find that in this newsletter and the other aspects of my ministry, I will be covering many topics addressed by our bishops. They have provided us with a wonderful pastoral plan that addresses contemporary issues of our society.

I look forward to working with all of you who share my faith and belief in the gift and sacrament of life. Please contact me with your requests, inquires and comments as they come to you. I am so proud of all the work the Body of Christ has done in our world, to value the life God has given us, individually and collectively. May God continue to bless your lives and your call to a consistent ethic of life.

## Advent Reflection

It cannot tolerate bias and discrimination, for human life is sacred and inviolable at every stage and in every situation; it is an indivisible good" (*The Gospel of Life*, no. 87).

## Answering Evil

The church's task after more than 330 were killed Sept. 3 in the school massacre in Beslan in southern Russia "will be to calm emotions and discourage people from answering evil with evil. But it won't be easy to convince a father who's lost his wife and four children—not by some natural catastrophe but through a human act of terror," said Father Janusz Blaut, pastor of the Catholic parish in Vladykavkaz, capital of the North Ossetia province where Beslan is located. The priest spoke by telephone Sept. 7 after attending a third day of funerals in Beslan. He said that local Christians and Muslims had been united in attempts to en-

sure that local reactions did not "pour oil on a fire that can't be put out." Most residents of North Ossetia are Orthodox Church members, while the neighboring breakaway Chechnya republic is predominantly Muslim...

Pope John Paul II prayed for victims of the Russian school siege, calling their deaths a "cruel epilogue" to a savage attack. In a telegram Sept. 4, the pope called the school takeover a "vile and heartless act of aggression against defenseless children and families." The pope condemned "every form of terrorism" and said he hoped that a "spiral of hatred and violence would not prevail." He expressed affection for the Russian people "in this moment of anguish..."

# A Prophetic Model of Church

*Bishop Gabino Zavala is an Auxiliary Bishop in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles and Bishop President of Pax Christi USA. This article is an excerpt from a keynote speech written for the 2004 Pax Christi USA National Assembly in Miami, Fla.*

The Gospel addresses the quality of human life and the conditions in which it is nurtured. It demands that persons, societies, institutions and systems that oppress be converted. Witnessing to the love of God in Jesus compels us to exercise our preferential option for the poor: to be voices for the voiceless, to act on behalf of those most in need—to be prophetic! There can be no justice without the promotion of human life, the inclusion of all peoples, the recognition of the dignity of the human person and the complete liberation from anything that diminishes the human person—hunger, poverty, disease, violence and homelessness. The call to conversion, the struggle for justice and the commitment to transform the world are inherent to our being Church, the people of God.

The role of the prophet was to insure that God's word was heard and that God's law was lived. The word and the

law are embodied in the covenant between the Creator and all creation, God and all God's people...*I will be your God and you will be my people...I will always love you and always be with you...I have led you out of slavery, provided a land for you, made you my chosen, given you the law, instructed you in my ways...live as my own.* The covenant remains for all times as do its obligations.

In our era, the Covenant has been made new in Jesus, its obligations rephrased in the Great Commandment of love and its promise articulated in the Beatitudes. God's hope for humanity lies in the ongoing revelation of the Kingdom, which is the work of the Church, the people of God who have inherited the promise of a new creation, who live in a covenanted relationship with our Triune God, the disciples of Jesus, the baptized who share in Jesus' threefold call to be priest, prophet and king.

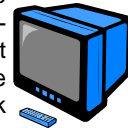
